Hiring Qualifications & Process

We employ a rigorous hiring process to thoroughly vet each applicant's qualifications. The process starts with an applicant submitting their resume and college transcripts. Upon confirmation of meeting our minimum requirements (bachelor's degree and >3.0 GPA in courses for which they apply to tutor), they become a potential tutor candidate.



Candidates take subject matter tests, an English proficiency test, and a computer literacy test. Upon passing, they join an interview, have their references checked, and undergo their first background check which includes fingerprinting. The successful candidate would then be invited to join our team.



Training & Professional Development

NetTutor has developed a research-based tutor training program that is aligned with the methods developed by the Association for the Coaching and Tutoring Profession (ACTP), the College Reading and Learning Association (CRLA), and the Association of Colleges for Tutoring & Learning Assistance (ACTLA) Online Tutoring Standards. In fact, we collaborated in ACTLA workgroups to create their online tutoring standards. We have been an active participant in these primary professional organizations and not just as vendors, but as true partners and learning assistance peers with a deep appreciation for what constitutes an effective learning center.

New tutors are required to complete these modules prior to student contact:

- Overview Of Technology (Introduction to the NetTutor Platform)
- NetTutor Methodology: Live Tutoring & Student Agency (modeled after the California Tutor Project, which was published by its Director, Ross MacDonald, as the Tutoring Cycle in *The Master Tutor*)
- Also: FERPA; Offering Accessible Tutoring (Technology & Service); ESL; QC Rubric
